

Brighton Kaoma is the Global Director of the **United Nations Sustainable Development Solutions Network (UN SDSN Youth)** in New York City. In this role, he leads global efforts involving 4000+ young entrepreneurs, scientists, artists, and activists working on local solutions to the Sustainable Development Goals across 100+ countries. Brighton is a recipient of the Queen's Young Leaders award from Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II; In 2016, he became the first African to be awarded the **Global WWF International President's Award** for his passion in designing scalable solutions for the climate crisis. A Mandela Washington Fellow for African Leaders and an ex-UNICEF Climate Ambassador,

Brighton has previously worked for WWF International and spent four years as Country Manager (Zambia) for the Children's Radio Foundation of South African that equips 2000+ African youth with journalism and leadership skills for increased participation in governance, climate action, and social justice. He has engaged in exclusive meetings with Head of states and thought leaders including President Barack Obama, Angela Merkel, The Duke and Duchess of Sussex. An acclaimed public speaker and storyteller, Brighton was the 2012 commencement speaker at Maastricht Business School (Netherlands).

In 2022 he gave the commencement speech at the Boston Arts Academy in Boston, Massachusetts. Brighton is a graduate of the Master of Public Administration (MPA) in Environmental Science and Policy from Columbia University in New York and is currently reading for a Law degree. His first *memoir* is set to come out in January 2023.
